- 1. An Election is to be held of One Member of Parliament for Dorking and Horley.
- 2. Forms of nomination for the Parliamentary Election may be obtained at Pippbrook, Dorking, Surrey, RH4 1SJ from the Acting Returning Officer who will, at the request of an elector for any electoral area prepare a nomination paper for signature.
- 3. Nomination papers must be delivered to the Acting Returning Officer at the offices of Mole Valley District Council, at the address shown below, from the day after the publication of this notice, between 10am and 4pm (excluding bank holidays) but no later than 4pm on Friday 7 June 2024. We request that an appointment be made so that we can ensure there is someone available to receive the papers.
- 4. The required deposit (£500) may be made either by means of a banker's draft, cash or electronic transfer of funds.
- 5. If the election is contested the poll will take place on Thursday 4 July 2024.
- Applications to register to vote must reach the Electoral Registration Officer by 12 midnight on Tuesday 18 June 2024. Applications can be made online: https://www.gov.uk/register-to-vote.
- Applications, amendments or cancellations of postal votes (including postal proxy votes) must reach the Electoral Registration Officer at the address shown below by 5pm on Wednesday 19 June 2024. Applications for postal voting can be made online: <u>https://www.gov.uk/apply-postal-vote</u>
- Applications for a Voter Authority Certificate or an Anonymous Elector's Document, valid for the election, must reach the Electoral Registration Officer by 5pm, Wednesday 26 June 2024. Applications for a Voter Authority Certificate can be made online: <u>https://www.gov.uk/apply-for-photo-id-voter-authority-certificate</u>. Anonymous Elector Document applications must be obtained from the Electoral Registration Officer.
- Applications to vote by proxy at this election must be received by the Electoral Registration Officer by 5pm, Wednesday 26 June 2024. Applications for non-permanent proxy voting arrangements can be made online: <u>https://www.gov.uk/apply-proxy-vote</u>. Applications for permanent proxy arrangements must be obtained from the Electoral Registration Officer.
- 10. Applications to vote by emergency proxy on grounds of occupation, service or employment, medical condition, or the loss, theft or destruction of photographic identification to be used at the polling station, arising after **5pm**, **Wednesday 26 June 2024**, must be received by the Electoral Registration Officer by **5pm**, **Thursday 4 July 2024**.
